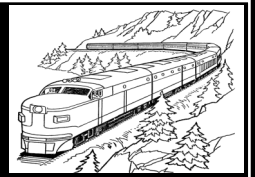

Living Life Out of Gratitude

“Be joyful always, pray continually. Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.”
1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Jayne’s grandma Mabel lived to be 96-98. She had three boys of her own who had large families. She had many children who called her Grandma from the neighborhood. She had incredible patience for children. Her husband passed away from cancer in the late 70’s so she lived alone for the next 20+ years. In those last years she lived at one of the nursing homes in Willmar, MN. One Sunday morning, after eating breakfast, the nurse’s aid was pushing Grandma Mabel back to her room, Grandma Mabel turned to the aid and said, “You are so good to me, Thank you.” When they arrived at the room, Grandma Mabel was with the Lord. Her last words were words of gratitude.

I ask you this, why do so many people wait until a funeral

service to talk about how much he/she appreciated the person who is no longer there? What is our best excuse for not extending gratitude to others?

My best guess why we do not extend gratitude is either we take others for granted or believe we deserve what we have received and therefore we do not have to say “thank you” - we believe in entitlement. As I write this, I remember I need to send thank you cards to parents for a wonderful Christmas. My responsibility in this non-gratitude lifestyle is to confess my self-righteous sin of laziness, entitlement and forgetfulness. I need to confess and repent of this ungrateful way of life.

Paul is encouraging the believers in Thessalonica and Moose Lake to live differently than the rest of society. Instead of living selfishly and forgetfully, we can choose to live out of gratitude/ thankfulness. This shift in mind-set and heart-set happens when

we realize that we receive from God not what we deserve, rather what He gives from His grace and love towards us. All we have are gifts of God’s goodness, love, compassion, grace and mercy, and the only reasonable response is “thank you.”

I want to encourage you to live out of gratitude -- a thankful heart toward God and toward others this year. Write notes of thanks and give them to teachers or worship teams. Say thank you to the people who help serve coffee and bars. Write a letter of thanks to the nursery staff. Bring a cup of coffee and a smile to those in the sound booth. Say thank you to those who do the dishes or clean up after you. Tell the story of how a person blessed you to the person who blessed you. Begin to say “thank you” and you will begin to see God’s grace and mercy much clearer in your life.

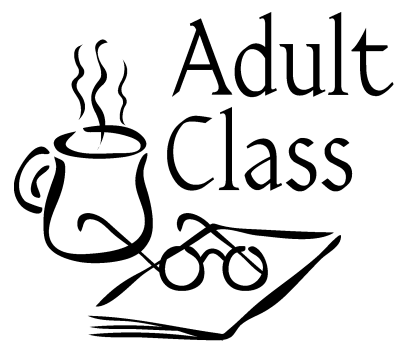

Food this month was: 4 pk chicken, frozen scrambled eggs, banana chips, potatoes, onions, frozen french fries and mozzarella cheese sticks, bread, pastries, frozen potatoes, English muffins, sweet potatoes, 7 grain buns, fresh eggs, and miscellaneous fruits and veggies. I was given some red pears, so I peeled and

cooked them, very good!

Since Don and myself were not at this Pantry either, we are happy to report that all went very well. Pastor David was not feeling well either, so he left about halfway through. There were 2 trucks to unload, someone was able to get a forklift to get the potatoes off the truck so they could be bagged, and others continue to unload, sort and pack. Registration went very

well, with many new people buying shares of food, Joyce Peterson registers each one, while Pat Skog, Mary Jo Fales and Joann Landry take the money and give out the numbers. John Berger and Joyce Peterson were able to count the money and get it deposited. Annette and Marlen Anderson were also very helpful. Annette usually gets coffee ready for the people who come, she also took over in the kitchen with coffee for the volunteers. We are thankful to each one plus many others that pitched in to get the job done. Since we were not there, some may have been overlooked but God knew you were there! Thanks to all. Next food distribution is Saturday, February 11 at 8:00 a.m. Hope to see you there! 😊

Promote Positive Body Image

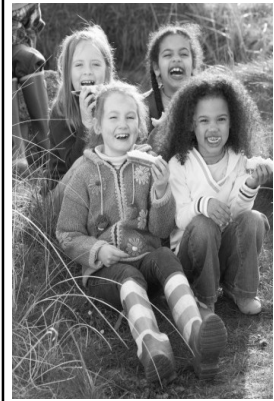
The topic of body image is usually associated with teenagers, but it's becoming an issue for younger children now, too. Media and advertising, toys, and peer pressure are among the many factors that make kids question their appearance and build.

But what's said and seen at home matters, too. Often parents inadvertently contribute to their child's body-image issues with their comments or through their own weight issues. A parent's focus on body image can make a child think his or her value is based solely on appearance. Here are tips for promoting healthy body image in your children:

- Emphasize that God created our bodies, which he calls "the temple of the Holy Spirit" (1 Corinthians 6:19).
- Model healthy eating. Show children how to make wise food choices, and don't require them to always clean their plates.
- Accept yourself. Resist an obsession with calories and pounds.

Chat with your children about body image by using these discussion starters:

1. Why did God give us bodies? What are some special things you can do with your body?
2. What does God want us to do with our bodies? How does he want us to take care of them?
3. What are some ways we can be kind to our bodies—and to other people's bodies?

FAMILY EXPERIENCE

Try these activities to celebrate God's gift of our bodies. The first works well with younger children, and the second works well with preteens.

• **Hopping-Popping Bodies**—Help children draw a gingerbread-cookie-type person and then draw arrows from different parts of the body to the outer rim of the paper. From the head, help children write words that describe what they like to learn about. From the hands, write things they like to do. From the feet, places they like to go. From the stomach, things they like to eat, and so on.

Read aloud Psalm 139:14 and use your bodies to express the information on the papers. Have children act like kernels of popcorn. Have family members "burst" open with their answers as you mention each body part. For example, say: "We thank God for our minds to think about..." After everyone has popped up and shared an answer, move on to the next body part.

• **Wonderfully Made**—Remind older kids of how wonderfully God has made them. Read aloud Psalm 139:14. Discuss messages that today's society communicates about beauty and body image. Then describe what God sees in each person. Together, create a poster that communicates either Psalm 139:14 or our worth and image in Christ. Hang the poster near a mirror as a reminder of how much God values each of us.



I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. (Psalm 139:14 NIV)

Everything God created is good, including our amazing bodies.
One of the many things we can do with our bodies is
praise God for caring for us physically.

Junior & Senior High Youth

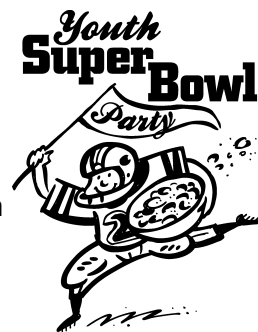
Junior & Senior High Youth Group
